They created the four constituent elements of the World Wide Web: HTML, the HTTP Web Protocol, a Web server and a base browser. In Christmas of 1990, Berners-Lee had created a Next Computer, a black cube based on Unix, easy to program, born from the idea of Steve Jobs, as the world's first web server. But at era, the web didn't seem really impressive. And it wasn't at all «World Wide.» Actually, it was more like a small intranet for CERN physicists. The information arrived a few buildings. The things changed after the Phulla Kunz physicist from Stanford University took a look at the future during a visit to the Berners-Lee office in Geneva in September 1991. When Berners-Lee showed the recovery of information via the Internet between the Next computers, Kunz was not impressed. But when he saw that it was possible to send a query from the Next box to the IBM mainframe of the Cern and recover the results, Kunz began to take an interest. The recovery of documents from incompatible computer systems has opened many possibilities. But would it work between computer to middle of the distance? À «TIM could not demonstrate how much it will work because all the web servers in the world were at CERNÀ», remember Kunz. À «It's not a very exciting demo." They used the internet to configure the Kunz computer at the Stanford Linear Accelerator Center (SLAC) with a browser and recovered a web page. "We were both shocked by how it worked. », Remember Kunz. Kunz and Berners-Lee then discussed to put something of substantial à € "the Carnosa Bibliographic Bank of Stanford of 300,000 physical references à €" on the web. Kunz went back to Stanford to do exactly this, with the help of the SLAC library Louise Addis. On 12 December 1991, the first Web server outside Europe went online at Stanford's SLC, California. The following month, Berners-Lee showed its web application to more than 200 physicists at a conference in France. For the grand finale, he connected to the Stanford server and searched into the bibliographic database. À «People have returned home from this meeting by telling their colleagues a new way to access [to the database] À» says Kunz. À «It was called World Wide Web, and it was fantastic." Many web browsers have been developed in academic or scientific environments, but what caught the attention was mosaic, created by the student of the university of Illinois Marc Andreessen. He has made the browser different mosaic is that it was a graphical interface, instead of being based on text, and worked on the omnipresent Windows desktop. The Andreessen team released Mosaic for Windows in October 1993. Within the following year, thousands of people were downloading the free browser every day.
