A crowd of passionate hearts already arrived on the scene and screamed while the police arrested Saldivar. Fans swooned over Frank Sinatra's sulfating voice. Sinatra became one of the most popular and influential music artists of all time, with famous songs such as New York, New York and My Way. He was also a successful film actor, appearing in The Man with the Golden Arm (1955) and The Manchurian Candidate (1962). Using tactics of nonviolent activism, King led the 1955 Montgomery bus boycott and the 1962 struggle against segregation. He also gave one of the most famous speeches in history: I Have a Dream. I want that song tonight. I mean, I want you to play it pretty tonight, play it nice." In response, Branch announced a deal. King smiled and said, "Don't forget. I mean, I want "Precious Lord." Play tonight." Shortly after, he went out on the balcony and was murdered. Pocahontas was a real person, but she wasn't like the princess in the Disney cartoon movie. He helped the settlers survive while they settled in Jamestown, Virginia. But we'll never know if he actually saved John Smith from being clubbed to death by his father, Powhatan. She started a whole new life by changing her name to Rebecca, tying the knot with John Rolfe, moving to London and having a son. However, her life was cut short when she fell ill in 1617. Before she died, she said to her husband, "Everything must die. It's enough for the child to live." Mahatma Gandhi was assassinated in January 1948. He was shot at Birla's house in India, where witnesses can't accept his dying words. Some witnesses claim to have repeated, "Ram, Ram" ("God, God"), while Gandhi's personal assistant did not hear him say anything. His legacy also inspires many leaders today. Anne Frank was a young Jewish victim of the Holocaust. She documented her life in a diary while she and her family went into hiding from 1942 to 1944. However, some eyewitnesses believe that his last words were: "Now, now, brothers, break up, stay calm, stay calm". Malcolm X was trying to resolve a staged dispute. In 1965, he was preparing to give a speech at the Audubon Ballroom in Manhattan when a disturbance occurred. While trying to keep order, he was murdered by three men. In 1937, Betty Klenck was listening to the radio when she heard a terrifying SOS call from a woman in distress. The woman cried out for help and repeated, "This is Amelia Earhart! The water is deep at the knee!" At the time, Coast Guard officials thought the message was a hoax. However, in 2018, researchers believe the infested transmission could be real. Their disappearance is still an unsolved mystery. Her last words to her husband were: "Please know that I am well aware of the dangers. Women have to try to do things the way men have tried. When they fail, their failure can only be a challenge for others." The world wouldn't be the same without Steve Jobs, the creator of iPhone and MacBook. His birth parents couldn't have a relationship with their families, so they put him up for adoption. His birth mother, Carole Schieble, hesitated to let Paul and Clara Jobs adopt him because they did not have a university education. His decision was worth it because he had a net worth of \$7 billion at the time of his death. Before he died of cancer, Steve Jobs repeated the same words to his family. He said, "Oh wow. Oh, wow. Oh! Oh! Equipped as a R & B princess, Aaliyah was one of the most adored singers in the 90s and 2000. The singer appeared in the film, Romeo Must Die, with Jet Li, producing the single, Try Again, for the soundtrack of the movie. The song reached the number 1 of the Billboard Hot 100 only on AirPlay, establishing Aaliyah as the first artist in the story of Billboard to do so. Harvey Milk was the first openly gay officer elected in California, winning a place as a San Francisco supervisor in 1977. However, he served only for 11 months before another city supervisor assassinated him. During the last year of his life, Milk fought for greater visibility for gays and helping to stop discrimination and violence they faced. The murder of Tupac Shakur remains unresolved. In September 1996, the rapper was struck more times in a shooting in Las Vegas.
