Monkey D. Luffy, commonly referred to as "Straw Hat Luffy", is the founder and captain of the Straw Hat Pirates, an infamous and powerful crew. He fearlessly pursues the legendary treasure left behind by Gol D. Roger, aiming to become the new Pirate King and realize his own dreams of freedom. Born on Dawn Island, Luffy's early life was influenced by his grandfather, Monkey D. Garp, and his friend Portgas D. "Fire Fist" Ace, whom he befriended and swore brotherhood with. His greatest inspiration comes from pirate Shanks, who gifted him a straw hat after saving his life. As a pirate, Luffy has battled numerous powers, including the Marines and the Four Emperors, and has gained widespread infamy through his accomplishments. He is recognized as a central member of the Worst Generation and has become one of the most valuable pirates, with a bounty of 3,000,000,000. The hat Monkey D. Luffy wears is a symbol of his childhood and dreams, given to him by his idol, 'Red-Haired' Shanks, who received it from Gol D. Roger. This hat led to Luffy's nickname, 'Straw Hat Luffy', and is also the namesake and symbol of his crew, the Straw Hat Pirates. The legendary treasure of Gol D. Roger, known as 'One Piece', is said to be the greatest in the world, and its location was revealed by Roger before his death, sparking the Grand Age of Pirates. Luffy's dream is to become the Pirate King by finding One Piece, earning him the title and the freedom that comes with it. Additionally, he has another dream known only to a few people. Luffy became the captain of the Straw Hat Pirates through his determination and adventurous spirit after eating the Gomu Gomu no Mi, which turned his body into rubber. His strength comes from his fearless attitude, mastery of Haki, and Devil Fruit power, making him the strongest combatant in the crew. Luffy is a young man with shaggy black hair, round black eyes, and a slim muscular build, renowned for his yellow straw hat and red hatband. He has a scar with two stitches underneath his left eye and an X-shaped scar on his chest from being wounded by Akainu. Luffy's outfit typically consists of a red vest, light blue denim shorts, and tan sandals, although he wears different outfits to suit various climates. Luffy's fashion sense is quite eclectic, often influenced by the places he visits or the company he keeps. He typically wears his signature red vest and blue shorts, but has been known to sport different outfits during various adventures. These outfits can range from parkas on Drum Island to desert robes in Arabasta. While he doesn't know how to dress stylishly, team members like Nami, Usopp, Sanji, and Robin sometimes offer fashion advice. During the Drum Island Arc, Luffy wore two parkas - one burgundy with white fur trim, and another checkered hooded parka. In Arabasta, he donned desert robes featuring dark red and light blue accents. He's also worn accessories like a black wristband from Usopp and a white bracelet from Sanji. Luffy's iconic Straw Hat outfit remains constant despite his adventures and transformations. Nami sewed a string strap onto it, allowing it to stay securely on his head or back during fights. Luffy briefly showed four characters on his arm spelling out the date for a future reunion with the Straw Hat Pirates. During his journey, he used his Devil Fruit powers creatively, altering his appearance in various ways. His Gear techniques dramatically changed his body shape and appearance. After two years, some changes became apparent. He grew slightly taller and gained more muscle mass due to training. Luffy's wardrobe varied greatly throughout different arcs and events. He donned an open, dark blue shirt with sunflowers and standard light blue shorts, along with a black bowler hat and fake beard for the Mera Mera no Mi tournament. For his battle against Doflamingo, he wore Viking-style armor, but later removed most of it except for his cape and helmet. After recovering from his fight, Luffy sported a dark red tank top and standard brown shorts. During the Sanji Retrieval Team's departure from Zou, he swapped out his light blue shorts for brown ones. In the Whole Cake Island Arc, he wore an open fancy white shirt with puffy sleeves and ornate gold pattern, accompanied by red shorts and yellow sash. He later donned a new outfit featuring a brick red blazer, matching shorts, black dress shirt, and pink cravat. After losing his top tooth in the fight against Sanji, it regrew after he drank milk. Luffy's attire changed again during the Wano Country Arc, as he wore a red yukata with blue rounded sun mon and yellow obi. He briefly had a topknot on top of his hair. Before assaulting Onigashima, Luffy received samurai armor from Hitetsu. For the sea battle against Kaidou's fleet, he donned a long black coat, usual red shirt, orange shorts, and purple sash. As he celebrated the Raid's success, he wore another red yukata with blue sash and yellow-and-white hexagonal patterns. In the following days, he sported a third red yukata with purple ocean wave pattern and orange sash. During his departure from Wano, Luffy wore his raid outfit minus the coat, with swapped orange shorts for yellow ones. Luffy's outfits have been diverse, often depending on the situation. During battles, he wore his iconic Straw Hat, along with other gear such as gloves and an earpiece. Notably, during fights, he would discard these accessories to fight more freely. An example of this is when Luffy fought against Kizaru; he shed his elaborate attire, opting for a more minimalist look in his original shorts and sandals. In the Elbaph Arc, Luffy was forced to wear a Viking-inspired costume due to Road's imprisonment of him within her Land of Gods. The outfit consisted of a long red fur cape, dark brown leather shorts, light brown pteruges-like strips covering his lower body, a thick leather belt with black feather trim, and a pair of long brown leather boots. He also sported a large black and gold Viking helmet adorned with curved horns and wielded a battle axe on his back. Luffy's physique significantly changes when he transforms into different Gear forms. His most notable transformation is Gear 3, where he can concentrate air within his fist or create a massive sphere of air in his wrist, which he hardens using Armament Haki for an enhanced appearance. In Gear 4, Luffy's body undergoes dramatic changes, with specific features depending on the form he takes. One of his most striking transformations is Boundman, where he inflates himself and transforms into a more spherical torso. He also increases the size of his arms to match his torso, spreads Armament Haki over portions of his upper chest, and gains distinctive swirls similar to those found on the Gomu Gomu no Mi. Additionally, Luffy's hair stands up on end, he gains black lining around his eyes, and his irises turn brown. The Tankman form has been less explored due to its infrequent use by Luffy; however, in the Manpuku Version of this form, his body undergoes a transformation similar but more exaggerated than Boundman. In this state, Luffy's torso inflates significantly more than the rest of his body, while his arms only slightly inflate. Lastly, the Snakeman form is characterized by a minimal shift in proportions, with most changes occurring in Luffy's newly flame-like hair. He gains less Armament Haki spread and has a trail of steam and fire that drapes over his shoulders compared to the other forms. Luffy's outfit transforms into white attire when in Gear 5. His appearance resembles Snakeman, featuring a cloud-trail on his shoulders and flame-like hair. The exact details of his Gear 5 form are still unclear. Luffy typically wears casual clothing but has donned various costumes for specific events and roles. Luffy's Outfits: A Colorful Ride Through the Straw Hat Pirates' Adventures During various arcs and movies in the series, Luffy dons numerous outfits, each with its unique design and accessories. Luffy's attire varies greatly depending on the occasion, but one thing remains constant - his bold and eccentric sense of style. When he first arrived at the Pirates Festival, he wore a large wooden instrument strapped to his back, which he later traded in for an open red button-up shirt, black shorts, and an orange sash. His straw hat was topped with a beige, patterned covering that unfortunately got lost during his battle with Douglas Bullet. However, it wasn't until Luffy left the festival that he donned a more casual look, wearing an orange tank top. The outfit was designed in collaboration with UNIQLO and has since become one of his signature looks. During Movie 15, Luffy's Festival Outfit took on a new form, featuring a red t-shirt with a white '56' logo on the left sleeve, along with an orange vest adorned with four fans and blue shorts. In his flashbacks to Foosha Village, Luffy wore a more relaxed outfit consisting of red shorts and a white T-shirt with a yellow 'X' emblem. But when he transformed into Gear 5 to deliver the final blow against Tot Musica, his Battle Outfit took on a pure white appearance, only to morph back into its standard form - an all-white ensemble paired with a purple sash - as the monster disappeared. Luffy's outfits and appearances have been documented in numerous episodes and chapters of the One Piece manga and anime. The Straw Hats receive Japanese armor courtesy of Hitetsu (One Piece Manga and Anime — Vol. 95 Chapter 959, Episode 959). Luffy often changes outfits during missions. He wears a disguise created by Kin'emon in Volume 97 of the manga and anime series (Chapter 978, Episode 983). Additionally, Dr. Vegapunk's invention helps Luffy change clothes in One Piece Manga — Vol. 105 Chapter 1063 (Episode 1092). Regarding his bounty, Luffy earned a current reward of 1,500,000,000 Berries after defeating Charlotte Cracker and Katakuri, two top-ranking members of Big Mom Pirate's crew. This places him among the highest in One Piece with regards to bounties. The discussion around Luffy's bounty touches on whether it is too high or not. However, given that he defeated his opponents, the reward seems acceptable. Luffy's bounty has plummeted by over 50%. This drastic drop in value led to increased volatility in the berry market, prompting the world government to reduce bounties across the board - with the exception of God Usopp, naturally. So, what was Luffy's most prized possession? After defeating Charlotte Cracker and Katakuri, two top-ranking members of Big Mom Pirates, as well as taking down Big Mom herself, Luffy's current bounty stands at 1,500,000,000 Berries. As for his crew's bounty, it remains unclear. However, Luffy's position as the leader of the Straw Hat and Chief of Staff Sabo's sworn brother should warrant a significant reward. Considering he defeated all four Yonko and became the Pirate King, Luffy's bounty will likely surpass any other Yonko, including Gol D Roger's 1 billion Berries. Usopp might also receive a bounty around 2 billion Berries at the end of the story. Ultimately, what is Luffy's reward? According to Oda, it will be a bounty exceeding 5,600,000,000 Berries, making him a legendary figure beyond his generation. But why this specific number? It just so happens that 56 holds special significance for Luffy - his lucky number.
